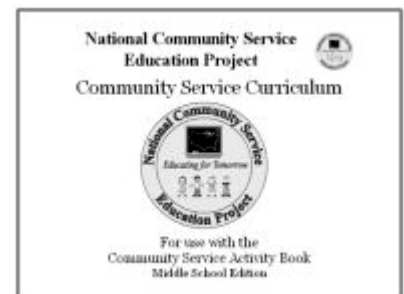
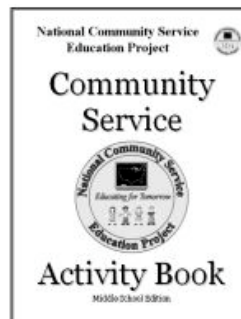
The K-3 activity book is designed to teach students about the importance of community service through activities like coloring, drawing and connect-the-dots and actual community involvement.
